



Unit Names and Camp Places



Unit Names

The choice of the unit name is very important and should be a joint decision of all the leaders and/or girls of the unit. There should be no duplicate names among units. In addition, you will probably want to coordinate your swaps, dress, and flag or banner. Choose UNIT names from the following list, as these relate to the current theme. Your personal name, however, does not have to reflect the unit name or camp theme, but can if you need a name. DO NOT encourage your campers to have camp names. It's hard enough to learn their real name - on forms, attendance, badge reports, first aide, etc. Reserve camp names for counselors, adult and teen staff, not campers. Would you want to be called Mrs. Snow, Miss Jeannie for Jeannie Snow, or "Snowflake", your camp name?

Some name examples are listed; you might think of others. Add a catchy adjective such as perky prairie pups.

Pixies, Daisies, young Boys **Cartoon Characters:** Flintstones, etc. (ex. Precious Pebbles, Little Nuggets, CinderellaStone Kids, The Bam-Bam Boys, Bedrock Cops, Dino's Darling Pups, Betty's Babes, Superstar Kids, etc.)

Brownies: **Geology:** rock, gem, stone, mineral, rock formations, etc. (ex. Awesome Jewels, Rolling Stones, Mystical Marbles, Nutty Nuggets, Fruity Nuggets, Sparkly Gemstones, Precious Rockin' Stones, Classy Globe Trotters, The Singing Pearls, The Cave Kids, etc)

Juniors: **Music or Sports:** rock stars, dancing, band instruments, rock sports, etc. (ex. Rockin' Wonders, Jazzy Jumping Juniors, Rock-n-roll Maniacs, Darling Drummerettes, Disco Dancers, Boogie Dancers, Glitzy Gals, Scrambling Climbers, etc.)
